Ancient Egypt - Farming rich land around the Nile River

- Farmed in fertile soil along the Nile River, growing crops like wheat and barley
- Created irrigation systems to water their crops with water from the Nile River
- **Traded** goods like gold, papyrus and grain along the Nile River and the Mediterranean coast
